The film made to insult to prophet of Islam (peace be upon him) is the beginning of a new model of hatred and misinformation that exploits freedom to assault all religious symbols. It will herald a spate of similar attacks on sacred symbols in all religions.

Religions however should be respected. In the Islamic understanding they are protected rights that should not be aggressed upon, thus strengthening the fabric of society and ensuring a diversity of faiths and cultures.

For this purpose, the Quran provides the most eloquent illustration of tolerance and acceptance of others in the verse "And do not insult those who invoke other than Allah, lest they insult Allah in enmity without knowledge. Thus We have made pleasing to every community their deeds. Then to their Lord is their return, and He will inform them about what they used to do."


This is the difference between the Quran revealed to the prophet Muhammad, as opposed to the vile lies of those occupied with hating and slander of others.
