Despite the fact that many museums around the world have magnificent astrolabes on display, not many of them have special exhibits or programs aiming at educating the public on how these instruments actually work. This workshop aims at filling that gap and is a unique opportunity to be introduced to the astrolabe and learn more about its history, principles and anatomy and most importantly, how it works, by hands-on experience.


