Assalam Alaykum

By the **Grace of Allah alone**, I have reached the final round of the '**EH1 IT healthcare champion award 2013'** (see link) for pathology/IT based projects which has '**saved patient lives**' in a busy A&E department of **West Middlesex University Hospital, Hounslow area,London** and we would like to **expand and disseminate this project to other Hospitals in the UK**. I believe I am the only 'muslim' amongst the 6 candidates selected for this National award.

This initiative ascertained whether interfacing Point of Care Testing (POCT) devices to a clinical order communications system (Sunquest ICE) improves clinical data integrity and reduces patient waiting times in an A&E Department. The study showed that patients receiving test profiles from this device experienced a 31 minute reduction in waiting time compared to a control group receiving the same test profiles from the main laboratory. The A&E clinicians stated that compared to the conventional laboratory service, the rapid availability of POCT test results facilitated rapid, safe discharge of patients with less serious complaints, rapid management of patients with sepsis, with the proximity of the POCT devices exploited with availability of a full blood count within 3 minutes of the blood sample. Also, the rapid management of patients presenting with dangerous cardiac arrhythmias was expedited by the rapid availability of serum potassium results within 3 minutes! This system has led to lives being saved in the department and has contributed significantly to achieving the four hour waiting time in A&E.
